



Pirates

Stevenson's great creation, the one-legged Long John Silver, is one of the most memorable characters in English literature. A few years after *Treasure Island* was published, J. M. Barrie created a similar figure in his play *Peter Pan* – Captain Hook, who had only one hand (instead of having only one leg). In any adventure story, it is essential to have the 'good guys' struggling against the 'bad guys'. Pirates were extremely suitable for the role of bad guys, as they went against the rules of society and lived outside the law. Unlike ghosts and monsters, which were also popular in the stories of the nineteenth century, pirates really existed, and therefore, they were much more effective figures of fear and horror for children – even older ones.







