



August: Mr Tushman is talking to August.

The Present Progressive is used to describe a picture.

Structure:

> We need the correct form of **to be** and then we add **-ing** to the verb.

> When a verb ends in **-ie** we change the **-ie** to **-y** then add **-ing**.

to die – dying

to lie – l<u>y</u>ing

> When the verb ends in -e, we cut off the -e and add -ing

to come - coming

to make - making

> When the verb ends in **-m**, **-n**, **-p**, **-t**, we double these letters and add -ing

to run - run<u>n</u>ing

to stop - stopping



Structure:

> We usually add **-ed** to regular verbs.

to walk - walked

to rain - rained

> When a verb ends in **-e** we only add **-d** to the verb.

to use -used

to hope - hoped

> When a verb ends in **-y**, we change the **-y** to **-i** and add **-ed**.

to carry - carri**ed**

to apply - applied

> When a verb ends in **-y** AND there is vowel (a, e, i, o, u) before the **-y** then we don't change the **-y**.

to pray - prayed

to enjoy - enjoyed

> When the verb ends in **-m**, **-n**, **-p**, **-t**, we double these letters and add **-ed**

to stop - stopped

to plan - plan<u>n</u>ed

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

- > Adjectives with one syllable ending in e:
- We add **-r**.

wide - wider

large - larger

- > Adjectives endig in a vowel + consonant:
- We double the consonant and add er.

fit - fitter

big - big**ger**

- > Adjectives endig in a consonant + -y:
- We change **-y** to **-i** and add **er**.

happy - happier

muddy - muddier

> Most adjectives with two or more syllables:






